

Jubilee Birthday Celebration

On October 11th, Pinecrest will have a special celebration commemorating the Lord's Great Commission to "Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." With His words to Mary on Easter morning, "Go tell", the Lord made a woman the first he commissioned to carry His word into the world. The women of the church have stood by this declaration, supporting the missionary efforts with their prayers and tears and toil. At the 1925 Synodical Union meeting, Mrs. Brice of Chester, S.C., proposed the establishment of the Jubilee Birthday Fund to commemorate the 50th anniversary or "Golden Jubilee" of sending out the first ARP foreign missionary in 1875. Periodically, the WSU designates a new missionary Birthday Lady. BEAUTIFICATION TEAM UPDATE

I appreciated the comments made by Pastor Carson concerning the Beautification Team on Sunday, September 10th. His comments dovetailed well with my intention to give the Congregation an update of our efforts since the Spring of 2015 to address the landscaping primarily around the circumference of the church. I have long felt that it is important to keep the congregation informed to get their support and possibly their involvement in what we do. Additionally, Pinecrest has new members who I feel could benefit from the knowledge of what was and what IS today. Many feel that you need to have a "green thumb" to be active in our efforts. While that is beneficial, involvement in this effort should be thought of as another way of giving back to Pinecrest. YES, I know that we tend to get our hands dirty in the process, but in reality it is "our hearts" that really matter.

Historically, since Pinecrest's beginnings, there have been a number of members who a few here probably still recall. Those few became the mainstay in the maintenance of the grounds surrounding Pinecrest. They took responsibility for the cutting of the grass, planting, re-planting and pruning of shrubs and general care of the grounds. Their efforts were endless and Pinecrest always appreciated them and what they did. However, times change and so do people. Some moved away, others just became too hampered by health issues to continue to participate as in the past, but the plantings continued to grow as they always do.

SO, in 2015, Pinecrest had landscaping that was a product of necessity and a challenge.

It had been planted many years prior having been moved from the inside of the open Atrium to the outside. In assessing, we had many shrubs that had outlived their "manageable" life. Therefore, some of these shrubs needed to be removed and replaced with shrubs that, in the short and long term, were more manageable and appealing. Think back 2 + years; do you even recall all of the large shrubs that surrounded the building??? For the most part they are gone! However, as Fred Elgin frequently reminds me, and he is 100% correct, Pinecrest is probably the only church in Hendersonville/Flat Rock area that is bordered on all sides by some form of shrubbery while most others are bordered by sidewalks or parking areas with minimal need for plantings. Presents a clear challenge!!!!

In early May 2015, we removed almost 50 shrubs from the North side of the building. Concurrently with Session support, we established a **Landscaping Fund** which would be used to procure the new shrubs and fund our effort solely through congregation donations. Shortly thereafter, we replanted that area (the North side) with smaller shrubs that could be more easily maintained. We also added the Japanese Cut leaf maple now located to the right of the north entrance door which was gifted by a generous friend of Pinecrest. Our intention at that time was to work our way around the building

through a multi-phased **self help** plan. We also formed a **Beautification Team**, a group of volunteers who would largely take responsibility for the maintenance of the new shrubbery since the grass and some shrubs were maintained under contract.

In the Fall of 2015, we removed another 20 shrubs from the South side of the building in anticipation of future planting with some smaller shrubs. We mulched the areas again in the Spring of 2016 and in late May 2016 removed another 12 shrubs from the South and the East end of the building. 2016 was a dry summer which led us to form a group of watering teams to ensure that as the dry summer persisted we did not lose any of the newly planted shrubs. The year ended with success of not losing a shrub and presenting a landscape and source of pride that was recognized by visitors to Pinecrest from the First Presbytery.

There were still some things to be done...Fortunately 2017 supplied us plenty of water so the need for an in-house watering effort was largely not required. However, as a group of us mulched the entire grounds on September 7th, Bob Eckley and his son, Rhett, with equipment, removed another 4 large shrubs from the south side of the building. Thank you Bob and Rhett.

Throughout all of this there are some members who need to be recognized as they have always been there to offer their hands and help in notable ways. For the last two years, both Fred and Katherine Elgin have taken sole responsibility for care and maintenance of the Memorial Garden and generously provided, planted and maintained the begonias in the planter in front of the church. Aside from being a deacon, Fred has always been there to assist with our work efforts. While not a formal member of the Beautification Team, many of the things that we have done since 2015 would not be possible without the assistance of Marris Byrd who has always met our challenges. A special thanks to Paul and Mike Rector who have always helped when asked to do *whatever* in the furtherance of our landscaping efforts. Team members Dennis Dodd, Mike McCall, and Mike Hicks have always been supportive of the efforts when time and availability permitted. Over time, Sue Brogi, Kim Myslik, and Kim and Josh Shelton have been great help when general clean up and less manual intensive efforts required.

In the future, one of the biggest challenges will be the health challenges and increased age for several of us and therefore the need for "new blood" to meet some of the challenges. SO, I would be remiss if I did not make a **plea for additional folks to join the Pinecrest BEAUTIFICATION TEAM. Anyone wishing to join, please contact Bob Brogi at 828-483-4574.**
